Subject: Continued Conversation on Race, Diversity and Policing

**Recommendation: Information** 

<u>Background</u>: At the December 7, 2020 meeting, the CVAG Executive Committee approved Resolution No. 20-008, which formally outlined CVAG's commitment to continuing the conversation in the Coachella Valley around race, diversity and policing. The resolution had developed out of extensive conversation by the Public Safety Committee, as well as an ad hoc committee formed in summer 2020 that was comprised of La Quinta Councilman John Peña, Coachella Councilmember Megan Beaman Jacinto, Indio Mayor Pro Tem Waymond Fermon and Palm Springs Mayor Christy Holstege.

The conversations by the Public Safety Committee, the ad hoc committee, and the community in general have centered on systemic racism, use of excessive force, public right to protest, and potential rioting. It also has included thoughtful input about potential next steps and best practices. Many of CVAG's member jurisdictions, and their law enforcement personnel, have held community listening sessions to keep this conversation moving forward.

In late 2020, Riverside County wrapped up its own series of listening sessions. The county partnered with the School of Public Policy at the University of California, Riverside to prepare a summary of the comments that had been received. From these comments, recurring themes and topics emerged that included systemic racism and inequity; public safety and criminal justice reform; funding for social services; the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic; marijuana and industrial hemp; climate change; and education. County staff has compiled the information and presented it to the Board of Supervisors as a way to inform County policy and balance the pressing social, healthcare, public safety, workforce, and education needs of Riverside County amid the growing financial constraints. The Board of Supervisors has also endorsed the idea of a Community Task Force.

Jeff Van Wagenen, Riverside County's Assistant County Executive Officer/ Public Safety, will provide a recap of the County's efforts, summarize the feedback and provide insight about the next steps at the February 8 meeting of the Public Safety Committee.

Subject: Legislative Update

**Recommendation: Information** 

<u>Background</u>: California's lawmakers approved a number of bills in 2020 that establish new laws and processes of particular importance to law enforcement. Riverside County Assistant District Attorney Gerald Fineman will attend the February 8 meeting of the Public Safety Committee to provide an overview for Committee members and local law enforcement.

Among the legislation that will be discussed is Assembly Bill (AB) 2542, also known as the California Racial Justice Act of 2020, which prohibits the state from seeking a criminal conviction or sentence on the basis of race, ethnicity, or national origin. The Legislature also supported AB 1506, which requires that the Attorney General investigate officer-involved shooting fatalities where the victim is unarmed. Additionally, the presentation will provide an overview of some new changes in sentencings and probation.

**Fiscal Impact**: There is no cost to CVAG for this effort.

Subject: CV200 Coordinated Approach to Addressing Unsheltered Homelessness

### **Recommendation: Information**

<u>Background</u>: CVAG has overseen the CV Housing First program since 2017, which has had proven success in helping homeless individuals and families across the Coachella Valley. At the September 21, 2020 meeting, the CVAG Executive Committee considered options for operating the program after the previous contract expires. Following a thoughtful debate, the Executive Committee authorized the CVAG Executive Director to take steps necessary to transition the CV Housing First program from an outsourced program to one operated by CVAG staff, for a one-year period starting January 1, 2021, including hiring additional program staff.

The transition to an in-house program has also given CVAG an opportunity to focus its efforts on clients who might not be able to get help elsewhere. CVAG had previous launched a CV100 initiative, which used teamwork between service providers and public safety officers to actively help the 100 top utilizers of first responders time by connecting those individuals to needed housing, medical, mental health, and substance abuse services. CV100 led to a by-name list of 100 individuals with public safety officer assistance and coordinated street outreach in Coachella Valley cities.

This program has already brought about increased responsiveness and capacity in the Coachella Valley, as CVAG is working directly with public safety to help those who are homeless.

Moving forward, this approach will become a cornerstone of the CV Housing First program. To shape the program this year, CVAG has continued to work with law enforcement, member jurisdictions and healthcare resources to identify those who most frequently use first responder and hospital resources. This built upon the previous work, and all told has 200 individuals on it. The new program – CV200 – will allow CVAG to engage these individuals, who are on the streets and in encampments, with coordinated and consistent scheduled outreaches with public safety and homeless service providers. CVAG is also using its team at the Homeless Access Center in Palm Springs to provide necessary documentation and referrals for housing, medical, mental health, substance abuse, and employment services. CVAG anticipates expanding that outreach with a mobile access center, for which CVAG has recently been awarded grant funds. At the same time, CVAG will continue to use the rapid resolution approaches and the crisis stabilization units (which are apartments and hotel rooms) to connect CV200 individuals to services for housing, medical, mental health, substance abuse, employment, and – ultimately – permanent housing solutions.

**Fiscal Impact**: The CV200 effort is incorporated into the 2021 CV Housing First budget, which has been funded by contributions from cities, Riverside County, the Desert Healthcare District/ Foundation and grants.
