NOTICE INVITING QUALIFICATIONS

CONTRACTOR PREQUALIFICATION APPLICATION FOR CONTRACTUAL SERVICES

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that qualifications will be received by the Coachella Valley Association of Governments (“CVAG”) and Coachella Valley Conservation Commission (“CVCC”). CVAG and CVCC invite Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) for the various contractual services and will receive such qualifications *only by email* no later than **4:00 p.m. PDT on September 5, 2024** to initiate a Contractual Services Qualified Vendor List. SOQs will be submitted to procurement@cvag.org.

CVAG is a joint powers authority (JPA) formed in 1973 with the purpose of coordinating and improving the planning and delivery of governmental responsibilities common to all member entities within the local region. CVAG consists of representatives of 10 cities, one county, and four Native American tribes.

The Coachella Valley Conservation Commission (“CVCC”) is a JPA formed in 2005 with the purpose of preparing and implementing habitat conservation plans for the protection of rare, threatened and endangered species, and to acquire, own, maintain and operate habitat reserves for such species in connection with said habitat conservation plans.

CVAG and CVCC are seeking to establish a Contractual Services Qualified Vendor List to streamline informal procurement opportunities and provide a ready pool of vendors for recurring and routine Contractual Services to support key projects and programs including, but not limited to, the CV Link regional multi-use path owned by CVAG, and properties and associated assets owned by CVCC.

CVAG and CVCC are seeking the services of qualified contractors to provide a full variety of Contractual Services on a scheduled basis, an on-call basis, or emergency basis, or a combination thereof. CVAG and CVCC intend to establish one common, shared Contractual Services Qualified Vendor List to remain valid for three years following its establishment. In addition, CVAG and CVCC will receive new and amended Statements of Qualifications (“SOQ”) throughout the life of the Contractual Services Qualified Vendor List.

Following establishment of the qualified vendor list and as needs arise, CVAG and CVCC may individually solicit bids from the qualified vendors via one or more Request for Proposals (“RFP”). Submitted proposals will be evaluated based on availability, interest, capacity, and cost to determine the best value and in the best interest of CVAG and CVCC. CVAG and CVCC reserve the right to negotiate and establish the agreed scope of services, personnel resources, schedule, conditions, restrictions, and compensation as part of subsequent RFPs and contracting.

This RFQ will likely result in multiple contracts being awarded by either CVAG or CVCC for one or more services. Contracts may include scheduled services, on-call or emergency services, or a combination of thereof, depending on the contract.

The CV Link is a revolutionary new concept in active and alternative transportation that provides access for pedestrians, bicyclists, and low-speed electric vehicles (including golf carts) on approximately 40 miles of dual pathway that largely parallels Highway 111, the busiest corridor in the valley. CV Link is designed to enable healthier lifestyles, spur economic innovation, and make the Coachella Valley a more sustainable and appealing place to live, work and play for many generations of residents and visitors. The CV Link is bringing national recognition to the Coachella Valley as a leader in environmentally friendly transportation. As bicycling and walking become more popular modes of transportation and recreation, CV Link will help to reduce deadly conflicts with motorists as well as provide a safer connection to schools, employment centers, public spaces and many valley attractions.

CVCC is responsible for maintaining and advancing the Coachella Valley Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan, a shared regional vision for balanced growth to conserve Coachella Valley's natural resources while also building a strong economy vital to our future. The plan protects 240,000 acres of open space and 27 species. As a result, CVCC owns, manages and monitors approximately 28,440 acres of conservation lands throughout the Coachella Valley. Monitoring the status of conservation lands is an essential and ongoing activity. CVCC lands have been vulnerable to encampments, illegal dumping, unauthorized shooting, and off-highway vehicle (OHV) use. CVCC has approximately 18 miles of existing fencing, boulders, k-rails, signage and gates on CVCC lands, and many areas have seen extensive vandalism. In 2024, CVCC completed the La Quinta Peninsular Bighorn Sheep Barrier project, a 2-mile, 8-foot-tall chain link fence with 40 gates intended to keep wildlife off of the PGA West golf course. CVCC requires, from time to time, contractual services to maintain assets on these conservation lands including, but not limited to, fence and signage repair/replacement, graffiti and abandoned vehicle removal, and other services. In the past, CVCC has contracted fencing repairs, boulder installation, signage creation, towing services, and hazardous waste removal from conservation lands.

CVAG and CVCC Procurement Policy & Procedures shall govern this RFQ and any subsequent procurement activity conducted with vendors on the Contractual Services Qualified Vendor List. Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) are being sought for the following types of contractual services:

- Signage and bollard repair/replacement
- Curb barrier replacement

Offerors shall submit one (1) SOQ for any or all of these disciplines provided they meet the submission requirements. Contracts resulting from this RFQ may vary in scope, amount and duration. The Projects may require coordination with various Federal, State, and/or local agencies including cities, school districts, railroad companies, utility companies, property owners, businesses and residents.

CVAG and CVCC require that all vendors obtain the full content of this Request for Qualifications (RFQ) and any addenda via CVAG's website located at www.cvag.org/proposals.

SOQs will be evaluated and determined to be qualified in accordance with this RFQ. Vendors selected must be willing to sign an agreement with the terms and conditions required by CVAG and CVCC.

All questions must be in writing and must be emailed to procurement@cvag.org and received by **4:00 p.m. PDT on August 22, 2024**. Please note that all addenda will be published on the CVAG website at <https://cvag.org/proposals/>. Offerors are encouraged to check the websites regularly since each Offeror will be responsible for downloading the RFQ and any addenda. Offerors that have provided contact information will receive notification of any addenda.

Certain labor categories under this project may be subject to prevailing wages as identified in the State of California Labor Code commencing at Sections 1720 et seq. and 1770 et seq. If applicable, employees working in these categories at the site must be paid no less than the basic hourly rates of pay and fringe benefits established by the California Department of Industrial Relations. Copies of the State of California wage schedules are available for review at www.dir.ca.gov/dlsr/. In addition, a copy of the prevailing rate of per diem wages will be made available upon request. The successful Proposer shall post a copy of the prevailing wage rates at each job site. It shall be mandatory upon the Proposer to whom the contract is awarded, and upon any subcontractors, to comply with all Labor Code provisions, which include but are not limited to the payment of not less than the said specified prevailing wage rates to all workers employed by them in the execution of the contract, employment of apprentices, hours of labor and debarment of contractors and subcontractors. Pursuant to Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1, all contractors and subcontractors that wish to bid on, be listed in a bid proposal, or enter into a contract to perform public work must be registered with the Department of Industrial Relations ("DIR"). No proposal will be accepted, nor will any contract be entered into without proof of the Proposer's and subcontractors' current registration with the DIR to perform public work. If awarded a contract, the Proposer and its subcontractors, of any tier, shall maintain active registration with the DIR for the duration of the project. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the contractor registration requirements mandated by Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1 shall not apply to work performed on a public works project that is exempt pursuant to the small project exemption specified in Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1. The contract awarded pursuant to this proposal may also be subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the DIR.

CVAG reserves the right to conduct interviews to better evaluate Offerors. If interviews are conducted, CVAG will notify the short-listed Offerors of the date, time and location.

The award of any contract resulting from this RFQ is subject to the available budget adequate to conduct the provisions of the proposed agreement including the identified Scope of Services. CVAG reserves the right to reject any or all qualifications determined not to be in the best interest of CVAG.

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II. Request For Qualifications

A. Scope of Services

The Services sought under this Request for Qualifications ("RFQ") are set forth in [Section I: Background and Introduction](#) herein. Notwithstanding the inclusion of such Services herein, upon issuance of subsequent RFPs or contracts, the final Scope of Services negotiated between CVAG or CVCC and the successful Offerer(s) shall be set forth in the Contractual Services Agreement ("Agreement") executed by and between CVAG or CVCC and the successful Offerer(s).

B. Procurement Representative

The procurement representative for CVAG and CVCC regarding this RFQ will be Allen McMillen, Management Analyst II, (760) 346-1127, procurement@cvag.org, or a designated representative, who will coordinate the assistance to be provided to the Offeror for this RFQ.

C. Requests for Clarification

All questions, requests for interpretations or clarifications, either administrative or technical, must be requested in writing and emailed to the Procurement Representative for this RFQ.

All written questions, if answered, will be answered in writing via an Addendum, conveyed to all interested Offerors who have provided contact information, and posted to the CVAG and CVCC websites. Oral statements regarding this RFQ by any persons should be considered unverified information unless confirmed in writing. To ensure a response, questions must be received in writing via email by **4:00 p.m. PDT on August 22, 2024**.

D. Pre-Submittal Meeting

There will be no Pre-Submittal meeting for this RFQ.

E. Term of Contract

Contracts entered into for Contractual Services may typically be for up to three (3) years with up to two (2) successive one-year terms by mutual agreement of the Parties. CVAG and CVCC reserve the right to set the terms of contracts in subsequent RFPs and contracts. Extension to a contract shall be subject to the availability and appropriation of funds and will be at the same awarded contract unit prices and under the same terms and conditions as specified herein.

F. Insurance and Bonding

The Contractor shall maintain insurance and bonding as required by CVAG and CVCC standard contractual services contracts. Offeror shall provide in the Statement of Qualifications the insurance carrier and surety broker names and contact information, as well as insurance coverage and surety maximum capacity amounts. Insurance and bonding amounts shall be as follows:

General Liability Insurance. Offeror shall maintain a current commercial general liability insurance policy with a coverage amount of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate.

Workers Compensation Insurance. Offeror shall maintain a current workers' compensation insurance policy as required by the Labor Code or is legally self-insured pursuant to Labor Code § 3700.

Automobile Liability Insurance. Offeror shall maintain a current automobile liability insurance policy with a coverage amount of at least \$1,000,000.

Bonding. Offeror shall have bonding capacity of at least Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) per project and One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) in the aggregate for all projects.

III. Submission Requirements

A. General

Qualifications shall be submitted by email in Adobe Printable Document Format (pdf), identified in the subject line as “Contractual Services Qualifications” to procurement@cvag.org. Qualifications shall consist of a Statement of Qualifications (“SOQ”) and be submitted (emailed) in one email submission. The file name shall designate the contents accordingly. Only one email submittal per Offeror will be considered.

It is strongly recommended that the Offeror submit a SOQ in the format identified in this RFQ to allow CVAG and CVCC to fully evaluate and compare qualifications. All requirements and questions in the RFQ should be addressed and all requested data shall be supplied. CVAG and CVCC reserve the right to request additional information which, in the opinion of CVAG or CVCC, is necessary to assure that the Offeror’s competence, number of qualified employees, business organization, and financial resources are adequate to perform according to this RFQ.

The SOQ should be prepared in such a way as to provide a straightforward, concise delineation of capabilities to satisfy the requirements of this RFQ. Responses should emphasize the Offeror’s demonstrated capability and competence to perform the Scope of Services. Technical literature that supports the Offeror’s approach to providing the Services may be submitted to CVAG and CVCC in conjunction with the SOQ. Emphasis should be concentrated on completeness and clarity of qualifications.

Offerors are encouraged to visit the project locations, as applicable, to determine the local conditions which may in any way affect the performance of the services; familiarize themselves with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, and codes affecting the performance of the services; make such investigations, as it may deem necessary for performance of the services within the terms of this SOQ; and correlate its observations, investigations, and determinations with the requirements of the SOQ.

The SOQ shall be signed by an individual, partner, officer or officers authorized to execute legal documents on behalf of the Offeror.

B. Content and Format of Statement of Qualifications

The Statement of Qualifications (“SOQ”) shall be concise, well organized and demonstrate qualifications and applicable experience. The SOQ shall be organized and include page numbers for all pages in the document. Offerors shall submit only one SOQ, which shall address all the services the Offeror proposes to provide.

The SOQ shall be limited to a total of fifteen (15) pages. The Cover Page, Cover Letter, Appendices, Bid Form, and page separators will not count toward the page limit. The SOQ shall be structured in the following order and shall include:

1. Cover Letter. This letter shall be a maximum of two pages, shall be addressed to Allen McMillen, Procurement Representative, and shall, at a minimum, contain the following:

- Identification of Offeror that will have contractual responsibility with CVAG and CVCC. Identification shall include legal name of company, corporate address, telephone, and fax number. Include name, title, address, and telephone number of the contact person identified during period of qualification evaluation.
 - Identification of all proposed Subcontractors including legal name of company, contact person(s) name and mailing address, phone number and email address, and relationship between Offeror and Subcontractors, if applicable.
 - Acknowledgment of receipt of all RFQ addenda, if any. **Note: All addenda posted on www.cvag.org/proposals for this solicitation shall be signed by the proposer and included in the appendices.**
 - A statement to the effect that the SOQ shall remain valid for a period of not less than 365 days from the date of submittal.
 - A statement that the Offeror does not have any personal, business, or financial relationship with the Offerors and Subcontractors that will be pursuing the services.
 - Signature of a person authorized to bind Offeror to the terms of the SOQ.
 - Signed statement attesting that all information submitted with the qualifications is true and correct.
2. **Qualifications, Related Experience and References.** This section of the SOQ should establish the ability of Offeror to satisfactorily perform the required services by reasons of experience in performing services of the same or similar nature; strength and stability of the Offeror; staffing capability; workload; record of meeting schedules on similar projects; and at least three supportive client references. Offeror shall provide:
- Provide a brief profile of the firm, including the types of services offered; the year founded; form of the organization (corporation, partnership, sole proprietorship); number, size, and location of offices; number of employees.
 - Provide a general description of the firm's financial condition, identify any conditions (e.g., bankruptcy, pending litigation, planned office closures, impending merger) that may impede Offeror's ability to complete the Project.
 - Describe the Offeror's capabilities and experience in providing contractual services proposed by the Offeror.
 - A minimum of three (3) references should be given. Furnish the name, title, address, and telephone number of the person(s) at the client organization who is most knowledgeable about the services performed. The offer may also supply references from other services not cited in this section as related experience.
3. **Proposed Staffing and Project Organization.** This section of the SOQ should establish the method typically used by the Offeror to manage projects as well as identify key personnel and Subcontractors. Offeror shall:
- Provide education, experience, and applicable professional credentials of project staff. Include applicable professional credentials of "key" project staff.
 - Furnish brief resumes of key personnel highlighting their skill, knowledge, and understanding of applicable subject matter, experience on comparable projects, education, and applicable credentials
 - Identify key personnel proposed to perform the requested services. Include the person's name, a description of the experience and qualifications, and descriptions of relevant projects previously performed by the staff proposed. The descriptions should

include what services were performed, the date of the project, and unique features of the project which would be beneficial to CVAG or CVCC.

- Include a project organization chart that clearly delineates communication and reporting relationships among the proposed personnel, including Subcontractors.
- Include a statement that key personnel will be available to the extent proposed for the duration of the Project, acknowledging that no person designated as "key" to the Project shall be removed or replaced without the prior written consent of CVAG or CVCC.

4. Appendices:

- Proposed Services: The Offeror shall complete the RFQ Response Form in [Attachment "A"](#) to this RFQ and include it in the Appendices.
- Recent and Relevant Projects: Provide examples of similar scoped projects conducted within the last three (3) years.
- Litigation: Provide litigation history for any claims filed by the Offeror or against the Offeror related to the provision of Services in the last five (5) years.
- Project Team Resumes: Submit resumes of all key personnel/support staff that will produce work product for the Services. Describe their qualifications, education, and applicable credentials.

C. No Deviations from the RFQ

In submitting qualifications in response to this RFQ, the Offeror is certifying that it takes no exceptions to this RFQ including, but not limited to, the Agreement. If any exceptions are taken, such exceptions must be clearly noted in the Bid Form and may be reason for rejection of the qualifications. As such, Offeror is directed to carefully review the proposed Agreement, the insurance and indemnification provisions therein.

D. Additional Stipulations

CVAG and CVCC reserve the right to accept or reject all or any SOQs and to waive any informality, incompleteness, or error in any SOQ. CVAG and CVCC reserve the right to amend the RFQ or issue to all Offerors addenda to answer questions for clarification.

All SOQs received become the property of CVAG and CVCC. Once a contract has been awarded, the name(s) of the successful applicant(s) may be made available to the public upon request. All costs incurred by Offerors in the preparation and presentation of their SOQs will be at their own expense, and Offeror materials will not be returned.

Unless specifically requested by CVAG or CVCC, no amendment, addendum or modification will be accepted after SOQs have been submitted. If a change to a SOQ that has been submitted is desired, the submitted SOQ must be withdrawn and the replacement SOQ submitted prior to the deadline stated herein.

An SOQ may be considered non-responsive if conditional, incomplete, or if it contains alterations of form, additions not called for, or other irregularities that may constitute a material change to the qualifications.

CVAG and CVCC will not compensate any Offeror for the cost of preparing any SOQ, and all materials submitted with qualifications shall become the property of CVAG and CVCC. CVAG and CVCC will retain all SOQs submitted and may use any idea in submitted SOQs regardless of whether that proposal is selected.

CVAG and CVCC reserve the right to cancel this RFQ at any time prior to issuing any subsequent Request for Proposals (“RFP”) or contract award without obligation in any manner for qualifications preparation, interview, fee negotiation or other marketing costs associated with this RFQ.

Issuance of this RFQ and receipt of SOQs does not commit CVAG or CVCC to issue a subsequent RFP or to award a contract. CVAG and CVCC expressly reserve the right to postpone the RFQ for its own convenience, to accept or reject any or all qualifications received in response to this RFQ, to negotiate with more than one Offeror concurrently, or to cancel all or part of this RFQ.

CVAG and CVCC reserve the right to negotiate any price or provision, task order, RFP, or service; accept any part or all of any qualifications; waive any irregularities; and to reject any and all, or parts of any and all qualifications; whenever, in the sole opinion of CVAG or CVCC, such action shall serve its best interests and those of the tax-paying public. Any subsequent RFP or contract, if any is awarded, will go to one or more Offeror whose qualifications best meets the requirements of CVAG or CVCC.

CVAG and CVCC may issue subsequent RFP(s) to one or more Offerors and may contract with one or more Offerors to perform the requested Contractual Services.

CVAG and CVCC reserve the right to negotiate with any, all, or none of the respondents to the RFQ; solicit best and final offers (BAFOs) from all or some of the respondents; accept other than the lowest monetary offer; and award a contract based upon initial offers.

CVAG and CVCC reserve the right to procure and contract for Contractual Services separately from this RFQ.

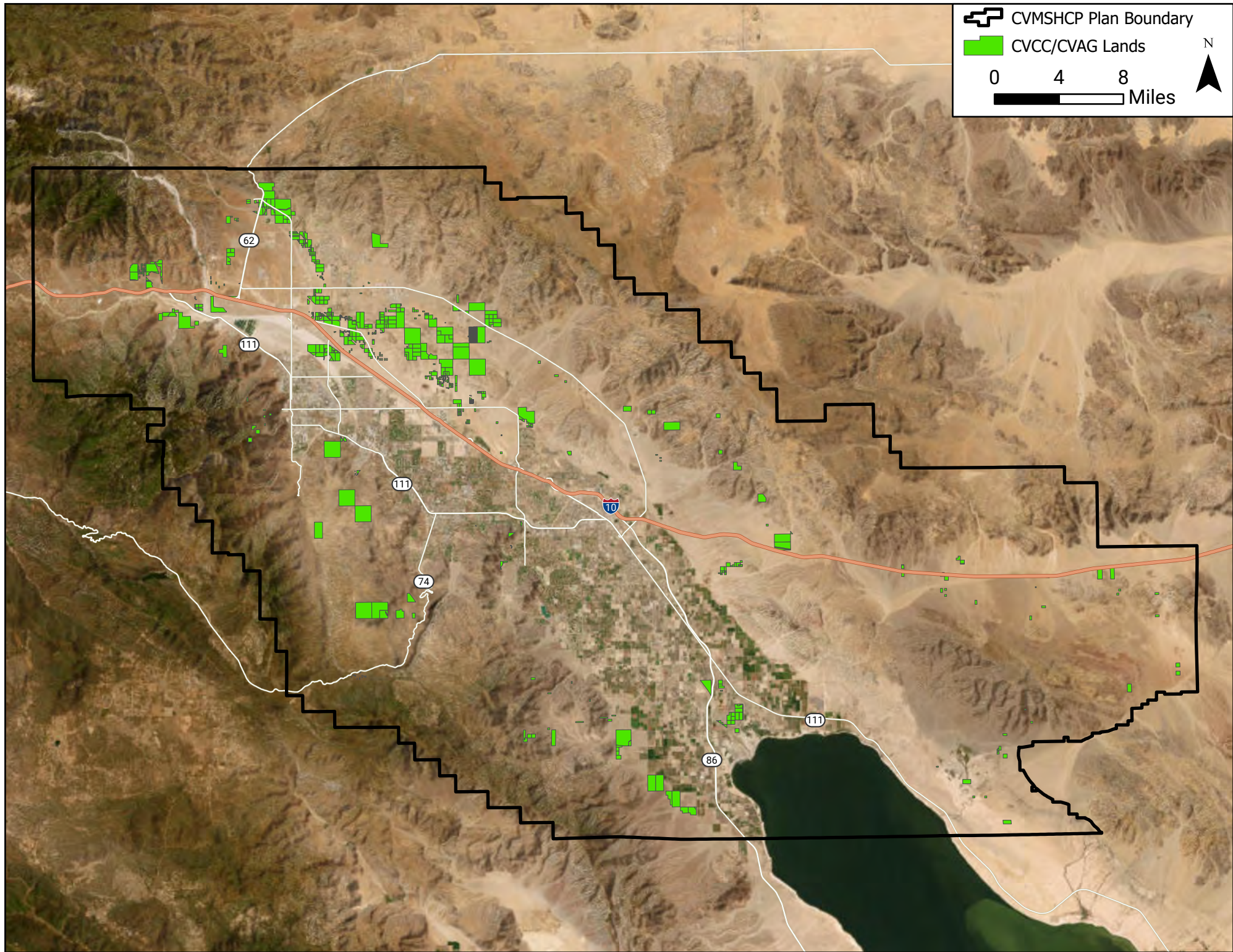
